Our panel readers were intrigued but a little undecided about it; so we'll give you the benefit of the doubt and put it on our list of acceptances 'if offered'. This means that we're not going to make a commitment to broadcast the piece but that we'll do our best to react positively to an offer of it, ready rehearsed, from an ensemble which is acceptable to us and which can offer it as part of a programme we want to have.
